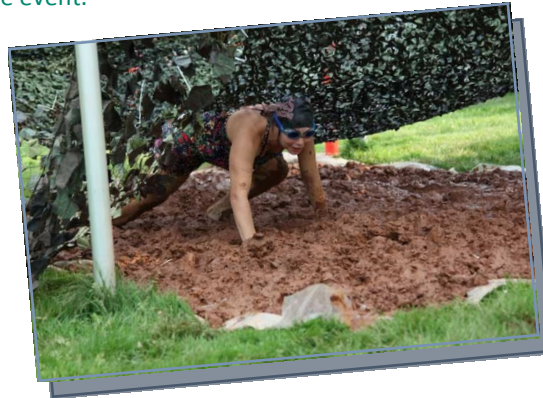

The Mud Challenge

Each summer the Town of Wolfville hosts Mud Creek Days in celebration of its official incorporation in 1893. A highlight of the festival is the Mud Challenge: An obstacle course relay race with community and corporate teams competing for the Mudley trophy. In support of the Mudley Fund, teams are asked to pay a registration fee and raise funds in anticipation of the event.

Mudley Fund Application Guidelines

Applicants must be 18 years of age or under, live in the Town of Wolfville, and are unable to participate in sport, recreation, or cultural activities due to financial limitations.

Applicants must be registered with an organized community group in order to receive financial assistance.

Applicants can apply for assistance with registration fees and equipment costs any time of year; however, approval may only be considered for one program at a time. Funding request will be limited to \$300.00 per application.

Applications must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to the start date of the program being applied for. Late application may not be considered. Applicants should receive application results within 2 weeks of applying.

Applicants must provide a reference who can verify a requirement for financial assistance. This person should be an adult who knows the child or youth and is active in the community (i.e. social worker, teacher, coach, clergy, group leader, councillor, or doctor). The reference should NOT be a family member or close friend. Clients of community services may have the application form stamped with approval. Confidentiality of all applicants is protected.

Cheques for registration fees will be made payable to the organization where the child is registering.
