Notable Investigations

Sept 2016

- An Impaired Driver was charged after operating his vehicle on Pleasant Street while over the legal limit.
- Large fight at the Anvil, however no charges were laid due to individuals not co-operating with police.

Oct 2016

- Male issued a warning for failing to yield to pedestrian at crosswalk.
- Number of traffic offence tickets issued. (Stop Signs, Cell Phone etc.)
- Ticket issued for new Noise By-Law for loud Party
- Number of Liquor Act tickets issued. (Drunk in Public, Open Liquor)
- Impaired Driver was charged after having care and control of his vehicle after drinking.
- Driver charged with stunting and served a 7 day driving suspension (Alcohol)
- Assault with a weapon (Stabbing) near Tim Hortons. Investigation is still ongoing.

Nov 2016

- Ticket issued for Noise By-Law for loud party.
- Robbery with injuries. Two males have been charged for this offence.
- Historical Robbery with injuries.

November 22nd- Cst. GAUDET and other members of Kings District recorded Public Service Announcements that will be played on local radio stations focussed on Impaired driving and Winter driving. (these will be heard throughout the county)

November 23rd - Career night at Acadia University. This event had numerous different types of future employment options for the students. Cst. GAUDET was there on behalf of the RCMP talking to students about our recruiting process, daily duties and career etc.
