5) DISCUSSION

The 13th edition of Devour! The Food Film Fest will take place in Wolfville from October 23rd-29th, 2023. As the pandemic has drawn to a close and other events and cultural organizations are reporting attendee returns to pre-pandemic levels, Devour! is expanding programming this year to reflect this new normal. The Festival theme this year is "French Cuisine et Culture" - The Roots and Reach of Acadian, Cajun, Creole, Québecois and French cinema and gastronomy with a special focus on the Acadian Diaspora.

Festival organizers (Slow Motion Food Film Fest Society) are looking to the Town of Wolfville to support a new area of Festival programming: free-of-charge musical performances (all monies paid directly to the artists). There are many other musical performances throughout the Devour! Festival, which are ticketed events. Funding is being sought for free-of-charge musical performances at these specific public events:

This event also celebrates our Devour! community volunteers that bring Devour! to life, most of which are dedicated and giving local residents.

6) FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Devour! is one of the Town's Strategic Partnership Program (SPP) organizations, and as such receives an annual grant of \$5,000 towards their event. As noted on the Town's Grant Policy, participation in the SPP portion of the policy does not preclude a one-time operational grant application. If the one-time grant is approved, the total operational grant to Devour! this year will be \$10,000. This does not include the one-time capital grant approved by way of an MOU approved in a previous year (\$100,000 in total if all conditions of MOU are met).

The Town's budget for all grants is \$275,000, with a portion of this amount set up as an allowance to cover funding requests not received/processed as of the date of budget approval (March 2023). This allowance was \$24,000. Earlier in the year Council approved a one-time operational grant to Stage Prophets for an additional \$8,000 above their typical CPP amount of \$2,000.

Council can approve Devour's one-time operational request without going over budget in the grants line of the budget. Council may also want to consider the First Quarter Financial Update Information Report recently reviewed with the Audit Committee.

These events are free and open to the public, being hosted in Devour! Studios (opening night gala after-party) or in Waterfront Park. All are welcome to attend barrier-free, with tenting available for inclement weather. This fosters community spirit, and appreciation for music and culture and helps residents and visitors alike easily see that the town is committed to community events and culture, promoting economic vitality and resilience.

Similar to the Wolfville Summer Concert Series but with significantly higher potential participation through festival patrons AND residents alike attending, Le Marché du Blomidon and The Devour! Cajun Chicken Dinner and Community Party celebrates regional heritage, the influence of Acadian Culture on the region and globally, cooking with local ingredients, free music for community engagement and a festive atmosphere.

In keeping with the Town's planned expansion and invigoration of Waterfront Park, this investment by the Town in Music across Devour! is a pilot for the kinds of larger-scale events that can occur in the park as it is developed. Knowing that significant investment in Waterfront Park is required to mitigate against potential climate anomalies, the more high-profile events that occur in the Park will acclimatize residents to appreciate and support investments in protecting the park and downtown to 100-year flood events and other similar potentialities.

Most residents and council would likely agree that Waterfront Park is still woefully underutilized as a central community hub. Events that are of multiple usage (Food and Music, Culture and Art) will bring more concrete appreciation for the park and the inevitable investment it will require to protect and create more dynamic usage.

The events are barrier-free, open to all and support regional economic development by creating catalyst events for visitors and locals alike during an international festival that will draw media attention and significant destination development.

Volunteers- Devour! is deeply thankful for the over 150 volunteers that bring the Festival to life. The Devour! Cajun Chicken Supper is also a celebration of our volunteers (all receive a free chicken dinner that day) and a chance to wind down Devour! in a festive atmosphere.
