	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What role does Acadia play, do they have their own policy.• Welcome Acadia and the community to participate.• For new subdivisions – consider looking at as their own project to create cohesion between all streets in that subdivision.• Consider categorizing the street names we already have, men versus women, people versus inanimate objects.• Creating an equitable branding culture; give people a sense of the significant history of the Town; not every street has a notice attached to say why it's named the way it is. Could each sign have a QR code which would take you to the history behind the name.• Culture of today may not be the culture in 50 years, representing current era. Consider the longevity of a name. Seven generations forward will the name given now still be acceptable.• Origins of name, some are anglicised to make it easier to spell and pronounce.• Create overall belonging and wellness. Prioritize equity.• Process to have more community persons involved.• Be mindful of dynamics within communities, how long have they been part of the community.• Information will be brought back to the committee around current processes, the Historical Society's decision-making process and what role does/should Acadia play.
